A Season of Joyful Anticipation

- The season of Advent is the time in our Church when we begin our new liturgical year. Advent means "coming" and marked by the color purple. We prepare to celebrate the coming of the baby Jesus in Bethlehem at the first Christmas. It also anticipates His second coming at the Parousia, when God will be all in all. We are also reminded that Jesus comes to us daily in His Word and in the Sacraments.
- In the Atrium, we begin with an Advent Celebration, where we announce this time of waiting and preparing for the Feast of Christmas. We will ponder the Messianic Prophecies and Infancy Narratives. During Christmas/Epiphany we celebrate the gift of the incarnation and ponder more about "Who is this child," a light that came for all peoples.

Nativity Story

- Students in 2nd through 12th grade are invited to act out characters of Mary, Joseph, Shepherds, Archangel and Choir of Angels (all nonspeaking parts) at the 5 pm Christmas Eve Mass.
- Students are also needed as gift bearers for Mass.
- All Nativity characters need one costume fitting. (Costumes provided)
- A required dress rehearsal will be held at Prince of Peace for all Nativity volunteers on Monday, December 23rd, 6:00-7:30 pm.

Nicene Creed
